414 Bikes Floating Towards Ghana

On november 28 employees of Cyclo North-South (CNS) and many of their volunteers packed 414 bicycles in a container. These bikes are on their way to Ghana in Western Africa where the Maata-N-Tudu organization will take them in charge. This group particularly works for the **emancipation of women**, as many partners of CNS. In the past five years, CNS has provided **11 597** bikes. This year only, 3 328 departured for a new life.

The bikes are collected throughout towns and cities of Quebec from mid-april till the end of october. CNS has collected a record number of 275 bicycles in only one day this fall. And guess what? This was happening in Christian's hometown, Granby. Congratulations!
